

#### INTERIOR RENOVATIONS

Thanks to a lot of help from a group of volunteers - including a crew supplied by our friends at Guildhaus - we've made great strides in our effort to improve the interior of the Albee House.

Carpet dating back to the 1960s has been removed, exposing hardwood floors that, at least in part, we've been able to salvage and will leave partially exposed. Drop ceilings have been replaced by drywall, cracks and holes in plaster have been repaired, and new light fixtures have already arrived, ready to be installed once all other work is complete.

We've begun the task of preparing walls and ceilings for paint, so stay tuned as we set our sights on a grand opening event to take place in late June or early July.



We've partnered with local author, historian, BIHS Lifetime member, and Blue Island resident Jason Berry; Kevin Barron, creator and curator of South Cook Explore; and the Historical Society's Official Historian, Ken Jellema, to create an Images of America book through Arcadia Publishing. We'll be releasing it later this year, and are happy to give our members the first look at the cover art above! Stay tuned for more details on this book's release, which will include an event where you can meet the authors and be among the first to purchase it.


BEVERLY COUNTRY CLUB Live at the landmark Ward & Florence Seyfarth House JULY 27 AT 7 PM
